4. President Report

1. Merchants (Heather) Update – Robyn (Coordinator) has been contacting businesses to see what is happening. Partnered with Sustainable Pittsburgh. They ask many questions. We have 7 or 8 sustainable restaurants. Gave 8 restaurants approximately \$1,100. Partnered with East End to promote who is open in Print. Councilmembers have been extremely helpful.

Restaurant Program with 412 Food Rescue – Restaurants will earn about \$25k and it will help food insecure.

Some merchants are concerned about fully opening. Classic Lines and Games Unlimited are opening for curbside only.

Uncover Squirrel Hill is hosting a June Zoom Merchant meeting. Hopefully the guest will be someone from the Health Department. How do you deal with a worker who has COVID?

Games Unlimited conducted a loyalty survey. His customers did not want anything other than curbside.

The Sustainable Issue/restaurants should be added to the SHUC website.

Honeycomb Gift Card Program with URA – Loyalty Notes – We can offer 10 of our businesses. 30% back with each gift card purchase.

Are there any businesses that won't open?

Loyalty program – through Saltwater to move forward.

 - a. Build outdoor seating for New Dumpling House.
- 2. Magazine We can't continue to bleed money the way we have in the past. Proposal Should we skip Fall and make Holiday Issue larger? Depending upon the Treasure Dinner we may or may not be able to sustain for 4 magazines. Cost between \$13,000 \$16,000
- 3. Earth Day Tree Supposed to have 13 trees in Squirrel Hill. Only one was planted by staff and carefully orchestrated. Sixth Presbyterian Church was the recipient.

They can't be painted unless they are repaired. We should be able to secure the rights to paint the mural and will keep the Board posted. We will be asking artists for RFP soon.

We will be placing another ad in the Magazine, have been sending out Social Media post, have attended/spoken at JCC virtual classes about the Census and are putting posters with different languages in locations like Giant Eagle and Rite Aid.
