Announcing our 2024 Squirrel Hill Treasures!

Dr. Stanley Marks—Chairman, UPMC Hillman Cancer Center, Chief, Division of Hematology/Oncology UPMC Shadyside; Clinical Professor of Medicine University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine. The Stanley M. Marks Blood Cancer Research Fund was created to advance innovative cancer care and research. In his compassionate and understanding practice Dr. Marks has positively influenced many Squirrel Hill lives.

Maggie Feinstein—Director, 10.27 Healing Partnership. Established in the aftermath of the Tree of Life massacre, the 10.27 Healing Partnership guides community healing efforts for those recovering from the shooting's trauma and from hate-based violence. Ms. Feinstein focuses on collective healing and resilience, impactful service and building community.

Rev. Canon Natalie Hall-Church of the Redeemer is a leader in interfaith educational efforts so important to our diverse Squirrel Hill community. As Rector at the Episcopal Church of the Redeemer Rev. Hall is continuing a long history of Redeemer's social justice work.

Place Treasure- Neill Log House. The c.1795 Neill Log House is the oldest domestic log dwelling in Pittsburgh. SHUC is the fiduciary for Friends of the Neill Log House working to restore this long-abandoned treasure with a summer 2024 planned opening to the public.
