Maggie Feinstein

Maggie Feinstein is Director of the 10.27 Healing Partnership. Established in the aftermath of the Tree of Life massacre, the 10.27 Healing Partnership guides community healing efforts for those recovering from the shooting's trauma and from hate-based violence. Ms. Feinstein focuses on collective healing and resilience, impactful service and building community.

Dr. Stanley Marks

Stanley M. Marks, MD is Chairman and Chief Medical Officer of UPMC Hillman Cancer Center and clinical professor of Medicine at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine. He is regarded as a national thought leader in hematology and oncology and is known for his clinical expertise, enthusiasm for teaching and the abundant compassion and personal attention that he provides to his patients. The Dr. Stanley M Marks Endowed Research Fund was founded by grateful patients and has raised over \$18 million for cancer research.





Rev. Canon Natalie Hall

Rev. Canon Natalie Hall from the Church of the Redeemer is a leader in interfaith educational efforts so important to our diverse Squirrel Hill community. As Rector at the Episcopal Church of the Redeemer Rev. Hall is continuing a long history of Redeemer's social justice work. She also works with Jewish Leaders on interfaith issues to help community members understand the traditions of their neighbors.

Neill Log House

The c.1795 Neill Log House is the oldest domestic log dwelling in Pittsburgh. SHUC is the fiduciary for Friends of the Neill Log House which has restored the house to historical standards and nearly completed the regrading and planting that will help tell the story of the life and times of the Neill Family.
